## ✔ Sharing, Self-Archiving, Deposition

You are encouraged to share, post, upload and host your GOA article wherever and whenever you want.

We also allow you to upload your work to commercial platforms like *ResearchGate* or *Academia.edu* even when commercial re-use is prohibited by the type of CC license assigned to your GOA publication (e.g. if the type **CC BY-NC-ND** is chosen).

## ✔ Publisher's Version

We explicitly advise to disseminate only the final publisher's version of your article. You can make it accessible either

- 🔗 by providing a link to your work on the publisher's online platform – e.g. your article's *Digital Object Identifier* (DOI) link (“<https://doi.org/10.3790/...>”) – or
- 📄 by downloading the PDF file of your work from the publisher's online platform and sharing it with others.

🔗 **Subscribe to the ToC Alert** of the journal in which your article is published to be informed instantly as soon as your work becomes available.
