Publication Ethics of Sociologia Internationalis

Editors of Sociologia Internationalis feel obliged to comply with the highest standards of publication ethics. In this connection, their efforts are directed at avoiding any malpractice in conjunction with publication issues. Mutual trust and commitment to scientific ethics is being considered as a basis for the system of scientific self-monitoring by Sociologia Internationalis as a matter of principle.

Editors' and reviewers' responsibilities

In general, Sociologia Internationalis only publishes original research articles belonging to the fields of sociology, communication and cultural research. Manuscripts can be submitted in German, English, French or Spanish language.

Drafts offered Sociologia Internationalis for publication will be reviewed (open peer review) by the members of the editorial board. The decision whether a contribution will be accepted or refused for publication will be based on the paper's importance, originality and clarity, and the study's validity and its relevance to the journal's scope. The editors commit to ensure unbiased review and to recuse review if necessary. Within this framework they furthermore avow their commitment to check thoroughly and handle confidentially the papers entrusted to them. Any manuscript received for review must not be disclosed to or discussed with others except the members of the editorial board. Unpublished materials disclosed in a submitted paper will not be used by the members of the editorial board for their own research purposes without the author's explicit written consent. In addition, the reviewing editors aim to adhere to review-deadlines.

Authors' responsibilities

The authors commit to own all rights of their papers' content. In general, papers describing essentially the same research should not be published in more than one journal. Submitting the same paper to more than one journal constitutes unethical publishing behaviour and is unacceptable. Manuscripts that have been published as copyrighted material elsewhere cannot be submitted. In addition, manuscripts under review by Sociologia Internationalis should not be resubmitted to copyrighted publications. Given that scientific publications serve as a primary medium of accountability and scientists' activity and performance, Sociologia Internationalis applies a strict standard to the contents' originality and self-reliance. Therefore, the proof of own and different preliminary work has to be indicated completely and correctly. Thus, authorship implies a substantial participation in the process of research as well as in the written account of the aforementioned. Bare technical support, administration

or membership in an institution liable to the publication does not justify authorship. Any form of „honorary authorship“ therefore is inconceivable.

In case of publication all articles, images and any other parts of the publication are copyright reserved. Any usage out of the strict limits of the copyright law requires the accordance of the publisher Duncker & Humblot GmbH. Please note that any copy is for personal use only.

When an author discovers a significant error or inaccuracy in his own published work, it is the author's obligation to promptly notify the journal editor or publisher in order to retract or correct the paper in form of an erratum.

Any aberration from these rules must be reported to the editorial office. It subsequently will initiate further action.
