

Statement of Peer Review Policies

Submitted manuscripts should fall under at least one of the LJB's fields (i.e. English/American Studies, Medieval/Modern German Studies, Romance Studies). In a first reading, the editor in charge of the manuscript in question will check whether it meets academic standards (i.e. correct and understandable language, no plagiarism, no earlier publication elsewhere), connects to the current state of research, and offers new findings.

If these criteria are met, the editor in charge will send the manuscript, in anonymized form, to two qualified national/international reviewers from among the LJB's Editorial Board (or outside of it) free from conflicts of interest, who will then conduct a double-blind review. Review criteria are: Relevance/originality of findings, comprehensibility of arguments, linguistic/stylistic clarity, inclusion of recent research.

Peer reviews are usually completed within eight weeks. In their statements, the reviewers give reasons for their recommendation or rejection and, if necessary, make suggestions for revision, which will be forwarded to the manuscript author in anonymized form. If the two reviewers arrive at opposing assessments, the editor in charge will make the final decision or consult a third reviewer. In case of two positive assessments, the manuscript will be accepted for publication.
